# CAMPGROUND RULES

# 1. REQUESTING A CAMPSITE

# 2. REQUESTING A CAMPSITE

\$25.00/ Night (Water & Electrical Hookup) \$10.00/ Night (Primitive)

#### 3. CAMPER PERMIT

All campers & tents must be registered and display a valid "CNDSTR Camper Permit". Permit must be displayed to be visible as you would walk by on the road or path near the camper.

#### 4. CAMPSITE

Our campground areas have some level space, and some not-so-level space. Please bring adequate blocking gear to ensure your camping unit is secure.

#### 5. CAMPGROUND AMENITIES

30AMP Hookups with Water available on-site Bathroom with Toilets & Showers

# 6. GENERATORS

Generators are allowed, however, please be considerate of your neighbors and limit use.

# 7. WASTE WATER

No gray water or sewer discharge may be made onto or into the ground. All campers using water must have on-board sewage containment systems and agree to haul away and dispose of properly. THIS INCLUDES "GRAY WATER."

#### 8. FIRE

We do allow campfires in portions of the campgrounds; however, they are required to be in a fire pot above ground, and cannot be in close proximity to you or your neighbor's camper/tent/RV. However, if you are camping in the stubble fields, there are NO fires allowed in this area. CNDSTR may ban campfires based on the weather if conditions are extremely dry and pose a fire hazard.

# 9. MAINTENANCE

You are responsible for maintaining your campsite including garbage.

#### 10. PETS

All pets including dogs must be on a leash at all times. You must clean up after your pet, ensure they are leashed at all times, and not cause a disturbance to your neighbors.

# 11. CONDUCT

The primary person on the Camper Permit is RESPONSIBLE for the site and what occurs there. If there is a problem, the primary person will be approached about the concern to try to resolve it. Be courteous and use common sense to avoid problems.
